

AT THE LIBERTY:

Encanto

DAYTON-Encanto, is the tale of an extraordinary family, the Madrigals, who live hidden in the mountains of Colombia in a magical house, in a vibrant town, in a wondrous, charmed place called an Encanto. The all-new original Disney film (with a screenplay by Lin-Manuel Miranda and others) features the voice of Stephanie Beatriz as Mirabel, an ordinary 15-year-old who's struggling to find her place in her family. "Mirabel is a really funny, loving character who also deeply yearns for something more," says Beatriz. "She's also not afraid to stand up for what she knows is right—something I love and relate to very much."

This Disney animated film is rated 90% favorable by the critics at Rotten Tomatoes, and 93% by the audience. The critics consensus is that this movie is an enchanting, beautifully animated film for the whole family. The audience assessment is that Encanto delivers gorgeous animation, catchy songs, and a heartwarming message. It is rated PG for some thematic elements and mild peril, with a runtime of 109 minutes. This movie shows at the Liberty Theater DEC 17-28 (2 Weeks, but not on the Friday the 24th or Saturday the 25th) on Friday and Saturday (Dec. 17, 18) at 7:30 pm, Sundays at 3 pm, and on Tuesdays at 6:30 pm (not 7:30).

Each of the winners received a \$100 gold bill awarded in four age groups.

On December 10, the middle school and high school students met in the high school auditorium, where local commander, Ron Standring, thanked the students who participated and shared some great essays submitted. The kindness of Waitsburg

WAITSBURG-Kindness is alive in Waitsburg. It seems like a prerequisite to becoming part of the community. It comes in all shapes and sizes, in acts big and small. From receiving an unexpected smile on a bad day or heading up an event, kindness is everywhere.



Food- 2,000 pounds of food were given away to anyone who could make it in March, 2021.

The year started strong, with more than 2,000 pounds of food distributed to Waitsburg and surrounding community members. The Waitsburg Christian Church, then led by Pastor Matthew Wyatt, helped organize the day-long event, partnering with Restoration Community Impact and New Beginning Christian Community Church. People went home with as many boxes of food as they could carry. Columbia County Undersheriff Robby Patterson showed up with a trailer to bring dozens of boxes to the Dayton Food Bank.

This summer, the Weller Public Library became a hot topic in the community. The historic library building was in the early stages of being considered for sale as surplus by the city. Starting at the city council's public meeting regarding the potential sale, the community came out to make it clear they wanted the library to stay at the current location.

Since then, the Board of Trustees and the Friends of the Library have been busy as bees fixing up the aging building, focusing heavily on bringing the building up to American Disability Act requirements. After the Friends of the Library's successful Halloween fundraiser, they could pour a large cement pad behind the building. At a recent city council meeting, Marie Gagnon shared updates about the wheelchair lift that would allow even more people access to the thousands of books hidden inside. The city has offered city funds, and donations have been steadily pouring in, getting the library closer and closer to the

goal of letting everyone enjoy a good read.

This year saw residents volunteer to be on the library board and run for Waitsburg's Parks and Recreation. New members for Parks and Rec are Bart Baxter, Leroy Cunningham and Beth Daves.

It's the neighborly care that stands out in Waitsburg. One resident recently saw Kathy Mason helping Anita Baker pump gas and added that Mason and her husband, Gerald, help care for Jack McCaw's lawn. It's what neighbors do in Waitsburg- we take care of those who built the town that we know and love.

Last Christmas, the Henze family had quite a tasty surprise. Their neighbors from across the street, the Constantino family, brought the family a fresh batch of tamales on Christmas Eve.

"It was the pandemic, so Dane and I were home alone with 3-month-twin boys and a 3-year-old," Jillian Henze shared in an email. "It was not an easy time for us. That meal changed our whole (sleep-deprived) holiday.'

Doug Biolo, co-owner of Nancy's Dream Garden Center, is always willing to help where he can. When snow-covered our streets and made for dangerous driving conditions, Doug was out on his tractor, moving snow, clearing sidewalks, and lending a hand where he could. The little garden shop supports the community, from unexpected donations to heavy lift-

December 12 was Poinsettia Day at the Waitsburg Christian Church when members bring poinsettias to the church in memory of a loved one. When City Councilmember Henze went to the garden center to purchase a memorial poinsettia, she said she struck up a conversation about the upcoming holiday celebrations in town.

"Without me asking or mentioning the Christmas Light Contest, Doug said he was donating a \$20 gift card as a contest prize and made out the transaction on the spot," Henze said. "I lovingly deposited this act of goodwill into the hands of Cindy Daves the next morning. He is a treasure."

The businesses of Waitsburg are some of the most supportive small-town businesses you can find. It's

not a surprise to see Waitsburg Grocery's name on a Tee-ball jersey or a youth soccer uniform. The crew at Ten Ton Coffee doesn't hesitate to whip up hot chocolates for the local preschoolers as they decorate the Downtown Christmas Tree.

The giving starts early in this town. In November, the Waitsburg Elementary second grade class held a canned food drive and donated over 200 pounds of canned and boxed food to the Waitsburg Resource Center, just in time to help with holiday baskets and

Downtown, Markeeta Littlewolf will kick off the procession with her rendition of National Anthem as the first of the floats turns left out of the Banner Bank parking lot onto Main Street. The parade will continue a route down Main to 4th street, to Orchard, left on 7th, and back to the elementary school parking lot on Main.

This is just a glimpse of what Waitsburg does best. The kind spirit of Waitsburg shines bright- even through a two-year-long pandemic. Our community spirit is stronger than politics, brighter than viruses, and thicker than floodwaters.

We are all Waitsburg.



Port of Columbia December meeting

DAYTON—The Port of Columbia commissioners held their last regularly scheduled meeting of the year at 3:30 p.m., Wednesday, December 08, 2021, via Zoom. Commissioner Shawn Brown called the meeting to order.

There was no public comment.

The Board approved the minutes of the last meeting and addressed the monthly budget report. The Port Director, Jennie Dickinson, announced the Port received \$55,000 in tax revenue from the County.

The Port received from the County a bill for the primary election for \$7820, which is about twice the past election costs for the Port. Brown stated that it was his understanding the bill was high because the only race on the primary ballot was for a port position. Typically, other entities would have shared the information pamphlet and ballot printing and mailing expenses. Commissioner Sean Milligan asked the Director to check that the Port was not being billed for both the original and corrected information pamphlet since the errors were not the fault of the Port.

The budget report included \$8,000 paid for an economic impact analysis to be sent to the commissioners and posted on the Port's website. The document looks at direct jobs and indirect jobs created by the Port's activities and discusses how the impact numbers in the report were determined.

The Director said the cash on hand in the budget report might be misleading as it includes \$403,500 earmarked for broadband matching funds, so it is not available to spend. The cash reserves remain at \$100,000.

The Director announced three changes in leases, one new lease, and two renewals. At Blue Mountain Station (BMS), the Co-op has agreed to a slight rent increase and is ready to sign a new two-year lease

In Suite B of the BMS, Mike Collins, owner of the Bard & Bee Meadery, plans to renew his two-year lease with a two-year extension.

Teresa Rae will rent a recently vacated space for an art studio with a one-year lease at the Port's Cameron Court location.

Dickinson reported a roof leak at the building leased by the hospital, which has been a recurring problem. An estimate to repair the roof came in at \$48,000, which she felt was too expensive. She will investigate other solutions to mitigate the problem.

At another Port property, Dickinson said Lyons Ferry Marina was still planning on adding ten RV pullthrough sites, a project she hopes will get started next year. The Marina reported that they had a "great year."

The Director and Commissioners decided to hold their meetings for 2022 on the second Wednesday of each month at 5 p.m. Since the Port conference room is too small to maintain social distancing, the Board decided to hold their meetings using Zoom. The new time and day for Port meetings are the same as Dayton City Council Meetings, so a citizen will not be able to attend both meetings. The meeting time was changed at the request of the newly elected board members.

Genie Crowe was appointed Board Chair to run the next meeting on January 12.

Vicki Zoller addressed the Board, hoping for support planning for a swimming pool in the County. Although she may find funding to build the pool, she feels that long-term maintenance would be a problem to support financially. After researching how similar communities maintain their pools, the Dayton Friends of the Pool concluded that the best way forward would be to form a parks and recreation district. To get the park and recreation district on next year's November ballot, 15% of the registered voters in Columbia County would need to sign a petition, and a feasibility study would have to be completed.

To move forward, the Friends of the Pool needs to have a community assessment and feasibility study to collect input from residents of a potential parks and recreation district. Schemata Workshop has been asked to do architectural work and help develop a scope of work for the project. Schemata Workshop will also help with the community outreach, facilitating three public meetings to gather public input.

The Dayton Friends of the Pool is asking for financial support from the city government, school and hospital districts as the project cannot move forward without the study. Ms. Zoller, on behalf of the Friends of the Pool, asked for \$5,000 from the Port. The Port did have \$3,250 remaining balance in their community support funds budget. The commissioners approved providing the remaining \$3,250 to the Friends of the Pool for their feasibility study. Zoller thanked the Board, saying this would "help educate our county voters and give them the opportunity to decide and put it in their hands."

Next, Dickinson discussed signing the Washington State Department of Commerce Community Economic Revitalization Board (CERB) contract to support the area's broadband project. The mission of CERB is to "enrich the lives of all Washington state residents and businesses by ensuring they have access to affordable, reliable, redundant and scalable/ future proof broadband technologies ensuring the economic viability of both urban and rural Washington state today and into the future." The contract would involve federal funds and include a federal audit. In addition to the CERB contract, the pole attachment agreement with Pacificorp was also ready for the commissioners' signatures. The Director compared this project with the development of the Lyon's Ferry Marina in the 1970s in conjunction with the Army Corps of Engineers.

Signing the CERB contract would obligate the Port

to provide \$96,500 in matching funds, which has only been an issue since the County has been reticent to announce any plans to provide their share of the matching funds.

The Director also announced that their application to the Public Works board for \$1,165,000 to extend the broadband project coverage westward to the outskirts of Huntsville was successful. This extension requires no matching funds.

There were no significant updates on the trail project except that it has been decided to plan on the Dayton segment to run down Main Street instead of Commercial Street.

As to the childcare facility, the group developing such a facility has submitted their grant proposal to the Washington Department of Commerce. The group has not yet settled on a location for the facility. The Director said that she does not expect the Port to play a big role in the childcare facility.

The next meeting of the Port Commissioners will be on January 12, 2022, at 5 p.m. on Zoom. The meeting adjourned at 4:52 p.m.




Owners Doug Biolo, Janet Lawerence, and their team are always so much fun to chat with, and they are all knowledgeable about the plants they have for sale.

an unexpected twist this week, I combined the spiced richness of eggnog with the silky texture of an Italian style panna cotta.

Ingredients:

MY RECIPES

Cotta

Luke Chavez

Eggnog Panna

- 2 cups eggnog, full fat
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 1 ½ tablespoons powdered gelatin, unflavored
- ¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg, plus more
- 7 tablespoons sugar
- 3 tablespoons spiced rum ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Combine eggnog and cream in a heavy-bottomed saucepan. Sprinkle top evenly with the gelatin and set aside for ten minutes

Set saucepan over medium heat and stir in the nutmeg. Heat eggnog mixture to 145 to 160 degrees, stirring constantly to prevent burning, about 8 to 10 minutes. Allow mixture to just come almost to a simmer, but do not allow to boil. When it reaches the correct temperature, whisk in the sugar to dissolve.

Remove from the heat, then whisk in the rum, vanilla, and salt. Pour mixture through a mesh sieve into a large measuring cup or bowl with a spout for pouring.

Place six ramekins, teacups, or decorative dishes on a sheet pan. Carefully fill each cup with mixture, pouring slowly to prevent large bubbles from forming. Gently tap bottom of cups. Use a toothpick to break up any bubbles that form on surface. Garnish tops with a sprinkle of nutmeg.

Set tray in refrigerator and chill uncovered. Once dishes are cool to the touch cover with plastic wrap and continue to chill until set,

Use the highest quality eggnog you can find, made with real dairy and full fat. Or better yet, use homemade eggnog. If your gelatin comes in envelopes, 2 envelopes should be enough.

I used a set of vintage teacups to hold my panna cotta, for a fun presentation. You could also try decorative stemmed cocktail glasses or colorful ceramic ramekins. If you feel comfortable, try unmolding the panna cotta for an elegant dessert. Lightly oil the ramekins before pouring in your cream mixture, then chill and set. When ready to serve, carefully run a knife around the sides of dish to loosen panna cotta. Then place a plate over top and quickly flip right side up to release panna cotta onto plate. Gently remove mold



Women on the Wing Lands in Walla Walla

While hunting is still largely viewed as a man's activity, the number of women hunters increased 25 percent between 2011-2016, according to US Fish and Wildlife Service, and the numbers continue to climb. Embracing women in the outdoors is not news to Pheasants Forever (PF), but their "Women on the Wing" (WotW) initiative is relatively fresh.

"In 2018, Pheasants Forever & Quail Forever's Women on the Wing Initiative officially kicked off in response to the rapid interest and engagement among women conservationists [and those] that wanted to learn more. The vision of the initiative is simple: To expand and diversify those who hold an appreciation for the uplands, and to increase opportunities to share our passion with others," writes Marissa Jensen, PF's Education and Outreach Program Manager.

The WotW initiative has boomed since its inception, with chapters springing up across the nation devoted solely to providing hands-on programming for women in the outdoors. Given founding members of our local Blue Mountain Pheasants Forever chapter (Chapter) included conservation-minded women like the late Bertha Hinchliff, developing a local WotW program has become a top priority.

In December 2021, a young lady from Tri-Cities, Kelly Merrick, stepped up to give the program wings. Kelly volunteered to officially form the Chapter's WotW Committee and take the reigns as the Committee Chair. As an enthusiastic upland hunter and conservationist, Kelly has a background in training and hunting pointing labs and is active in the Columbia Basin Pointing Labrador Club and other outdoor programs.

"Building relationships with working dogs through upland hunting has opened a whole new world to me. It's allowed me to share more deeply in outdoor experiences with my husband and my dog and has now become my favorite past-time. I want to introduce other women to bird dogs and the uplands and help them experience the same joy and excitement that I do when hunting behind my dog. Women on the Wing is a perfect outlet to encourage and grow our hunting and conservation community, and I am proud to be a part of the initiative," Kelly said.

Kelly's tenacity spurred WotW to life by drafting a 2022 Chapter program agenda. Events will include shooting clinics and firearms safety, hunting dog demonstrations, habitat and conservation workshops, and wrap up next fall with a "Women, Wine and Wild Game" event that provides a "field-to-table" experience and promotes pride and delicacy that is sourcing one's own wild food.






One Hundred Twenty-Five Years Ago
